February concluded the race season for the Racing Program with races held at Beech Mountain and Sugar Mountain. The Saturday, February 11, slalom race at Beech Mountain was held successfully, but the Sunday, February 12, race was canceled by a vote of the Racing Committee due to a forecast of ice and snow that would have made travel to the mountain dangerous. Persistent warm and wet weather during the remainder of the month made the final races on February 25-26 look questionable, however, Sugar Mountain was able to provide a course with good snow and sufficient depth to conclude the season with both a slalom and giant slalom race. At the Crescent race awards on Sunday, Ron Scott was honored by Sugar for his continued work to coordinate the race events.

Also, at the conclusion of the Sugar races, season awards for clubs and individuals were announced. A list of awards has been posted to the racing page of the Crescent website. Trophies and plaques will be presented at the Spring Convention. Congratulations to both the clubs and individual racers who excelled this season. A special thank you is due to Crescent Racing sponsors Dynastar and Atomic who annually each donate a pair of skis that were awarded to the racer with the highest overall points and to the Most Improved Racer. This year's awards were a family affair with Daniel Moniot (father) receiving the most overall points and Sarah Moniot (daughter) earning the Most Improved Racer award. In addition, Daniel Moniot and Andrea Pendley, as the highest male and female overall points winners, received packages for lessons and lift tickets at next year's 40th anniversary Steamboat Race/Ski/Ride camp in December, provided by racing sponsor Steamboat Resorts.

The Racing Program continues to provide an opportunity for skiers/snowboarders of all abilities to participate in a local, family-oriented event. Sugarloaf Receives Approvals for West Mountain Expansion. Sugarloaf received key approvals from the United States Army Corps of Engineers and the Maine Department of Environmental Protection to begin work on its massive, 450-acre West Mountain expansion, which will include a new a high-speed detachable quad,12 new alpine trails with snowmaking, and a new real estate development. Alterra Acquires Southern California's Snow Valley. Alterra Mountain Company has closed on its acquisition of Southern California's Snow Valley Mountain Resort. Snow Valley will join the operations of Alterra's Big Bear Mountain Resort, located 11 miles away in Big Bear Lake, which includes the Bear Mountain and Snow Summit ski areas. More. SAM

Multi-Dimensional Expansion Underway at Brian Head (UT) Resort. Development and construction are currently underway for Aspen Meadows, a new master-planned community and expansion at Brian Head Resort. A Powder Day Can Be Deadly—Even In-bounds. Here's How to Stay Safe. During the 2021-22 ski season, 57 people died at U.S. ski areas, according to a report from the National Ski Areas Association. This was up from the ten-year average of 40 deaths per year. The leading cause of death was high-speed impacts with trees. Three deaths occurred in 2021-22 from Snow Immersion Suffocation or SIS. Dynamic pricing, long a staple of the airline industry and concert venues, lets sellers jack up the rates when demand is high, penalizing people who didn't plan ahead, or, in the case of Arizona Snowbowl, skiers who have the audacity to want to hit the slopes of their local ski hill after a powder day.
